Operators struggle to retain staff and fill vacant positions

SUMMARY

Most operators (69%) report losing staff in the last year. Of the employees who left, 41% did so in their first two years with the company. The most likely subset of employees to leave are those in junior and mid-level operations positions.

Operators are most likely to increase wages for operations management (49%) and junior/ mid level staff (45%) in response to staff shortages.

Nearly a third of operators say their organization frequently extends shifts by two or more hours, and are increasingly reliant on contractors to cover staff shortages.


ABOUT THIS SURVEY

The Uptime Institute Data Center Staffing and Recruitment Survey 2024 was conducted online in August 2024, and had more than 850 respondents. This report highlights some of the findings.

Have any of your organization's data center employees left in the past 12 months? (n=381)




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Operations staff have the highest staff turnover rate

Which roles in your data center have the highest rate of staff turnover? Choose no more than three, (n=399).




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
Largest salary increases for operations positions

How long had the data center employees that left your organization in the past 12 months worked in your data center? (n=248)




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
Other data centers are the most common source of talent

How would you characterize the number of new hires in your organization's data center(s) in 2024 compared with 2023?




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
